Welcome: Inspired by Christ and his ministry of God's invitation, we proclaim, "No matter where you are on life's journey, you are welcome here!"

Restrooms: These are located on the basement level of the church. Either go through the double doors in the front of the sanctuary and turn right to go downstairs, or use the stairwell in the back of the sanctuary and then walk through the fellowship hall.

Children: Children of all ages are welcome within our worship services, so that they may learn how to worship God. (We readily expect to hear their presence and recognize their occasional need for a "break" from the worship space.) Children's activity bags, for use during the service, are available by both entrances to the sanctuary. A nursery, located beyond the double doors in the front of the sanctuary, is also available for children up to 5 years old. Please see a greeter for assistance.

Pew pads: Found along the center aisle, these are a great way for us to get to know you, and to share our welcome and thanks for your presence. Please fill out the pew pad and pass it along to your neighbor, before returning it to the center aisle.

Hearing amplification devices: These personal devices are available for your use. Directly connected into our sound system, they make it possible to hear those leading worship without amplifying background noises. Please see our sound person for assistance.

Remember: As we enter into worship, turn off or silence your cell phone, pager, or watch chime. Your presence is a blessing to God and to us! Please feel free to share with us any ways in which we might be a blessing to you in this journey of faith and life.

Leader: Come, sisters and brothers.

Come you who are young and you who are of much age.

Come and lift your voice, proclaiming the God who comes in peace.

People: As one people we gather in this place for worship

Leader: Here we light the second candle of Advent,

kindling anew the Peace of God that is for all people and all nations.

Turn us toward your peace, O God,


so that we may live within the beauty and life to which we have been saved, through Christ Jesus our Lord.

Passing of the Peace

Leader: The peace of Christ be with you.

People: And also with you.

(After passing Christ' Peace, you may be seated. Children up to 9th grade are dismissed to participate in age specific Christian Education classes for the rest of worship. Parents/guardians of first time students are invited to follow children to their classroom to complete registration information before returning to worship. Children, 3rd grade and younger, must be picked up from their classes.)

Psalm: Psalm 85

Leader: You showed favor to your land, O Lord; you restored the fortunes of Jacob.

People: You forgave the iniquity of your people and covered all their sins.

Leader: You set aside all your wrath and turned from your fierce anger.

People: Restore us again, O God our Savior,

and put away your displeasure with us.

Leader: Will you be angry with us forever?

Will you prolong your anger through all generations?

Will you not revive us again, that your people may rejoice in you?

People: Show us your unfailing love, O Lord, and grant us your salvation.

Leader: I will listen to what God the Lord will say;

he promises peace to his people, his saints – but let them not return to folly.

that his glory may dwell in our land.

Leader: Love and faithfulness meet together; righteousness and peace kiss each other.

People: Faithfulness springs forth from the earth,

And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.


