Certainly there has been the railing against the consumerism of the season and the need to keep Christ in Christmas. Yet, even as Christians, we pretty much continue along in the same general practices and rhythm of the culture around us. Though many of us have considered another way, the thought of potentially disappointing family, friends, kids, and/or our spouse has been enough to keep us pushing those changes out to some indeterminate time in the future when we will 'really' be about the hope and blessing of God. And all of this despite the fact that we know so much of the season is leaving us farther, rather than closer, to Christ and the hope we desperately long to be birthed into our lives and into this world.
